The <u>Style Committee</u> (SC) is a subcommittee of the CLC. Its purpose is to assist writing groups by reviewing and editing draft literature, primarily for conformity to the <u>S.L.A.A.</u> <u>Guide to Usage and Style</u>, but also for clarity and flow.
